IF SWALLOWED:

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

If swallowed, this material may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and cause bleeding. If ingested, administer Vitamin K1 intramuscularly or orally Vitamin K1 is antidotal at doses of 10–20 mg (not mg/kg). Repeat as necessary based on monitoring of prothrombin times.

TREATMENT FOR PET POISONING If animal eats bait, call veterinarian at once. NOTE TO VETERINARIAN

Anticoagulant Brodifacoum: For animals ingesting bait and/or showing poisoning signs (bleeding or elevated prothrombin times), give Vitamin K₁ at doses of 2-5 mg/kg. If needed, check prothrombin times every 3 days until values return to normal (up to 30 days). In severe cases, blood transfusions may be needed.

 $\textbf{IMPORTANT:} \ Do \ not \ expose \ children, \ pets, \ or \ nontarget \ animals \ to \ rodenticides. \ To \ help \ to \ prevent \ exposure:$

- 1. Store unused product out of reach of children and pets.
- 2. Apply ball in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and nontarget wildfile, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. DIRECTIONS FOR USE (Continued from other panel)

This product may only be applied to active burrows to control rats within 100 feet of agricultural buildings and man-made agricultural structures constructed in a manner so as to be vulnerable to commensal rodent invasions and/or to harboring or attracting rodent infestations provided that infestations of these rodents have been confirmed. Effort's should be made to remove food trash, garbage, clutter and debris. Bait must be placed no less than 6 inches into active rat burrows. Do not broadcast bait.

Do not use in homes or human residences. Do not place near or inside ventilation duct openings. Do not contaminate water, food, leadstuffs, food or feed handling equipment, or milk or meat handling equipment or surfaces that come into direct contact with food. Do not broadcast bait. When used in USDA inspected facilities, this product must be applied in Tamper-resistant bait stations.

Do not sell this product in individual containers holding less than 8 pounds of bait.

SELECTION OFTREATMENT AREAS: Determine areas where rats, mice, or meadow voles' will most likely find and consume the balt. Generally, these areas are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in comers and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rats, mice, or meadow voles' or their sinfs have been seen. Protect bait from rain and snow. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:

RATS: Apply 3 to 16 ounces of bait (at intervals of 15 to 30 feet) per placement in infested areas. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days or until signs of rat activity cease.

MICE AND MEADOW VÔLES*: Apply 1/4 to 1/2 oz. (1–2 level tablespoons) of bail per placement at 8 to 12 bot intervals in infested areas. Larger placements (up to 2 oz.) may be needed at points of very high mouse or meadow vole* activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bail for at least 15 days or until signs of mouse or meadow vole* activity casse.

FOLLOW-UP: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Wearing gloves, collect and dispose of all dead, exposed animals and leflower bail. To prevent reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation rispresent, establish permanent bait stations and replenish as needed.



PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed. Causes moderate eye irritation. Keep away from children, domestic animals and bets. Do not get in eyes or on clothing.

All handlers (including applicators) must wear shoes plus socks, and gloves. Any person who retrieves carcasses or unused bait following application of this product must wear gloves.

User Safety Requirements

Follow manufacturer's instruction for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry. Remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash hands thoroughly after applying bait and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet and change into clean clothing.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is extremely toxic to mammals and birds. Dogs, cals and other predatory and scavenging mammals and birds might be poisoned if they feed upon animals that have eaten this balt. This pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water, or be areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Runoff also may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment wash water or rinsate.

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
